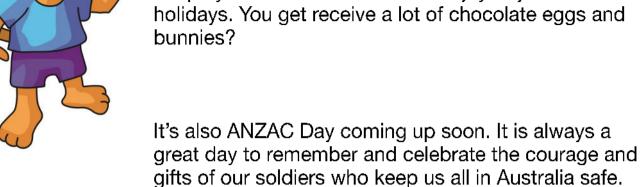

I was not the most famous soldier, and not even a general but a stretcher bearer who served briefly in Australia's first war. There is a



It was sculptured by Peter Corlett in 1915. I had a dangerous journey. I was one of the Australian soldiers fighting at Gallipoli. I wore the slouch hat with the Rising Sun badges. My donkey wore the Red Cross insignia. They called me a Hero, along

with my donkeys, because I bought in more than three hundred wounded men to the aid station on the beach at Gallipoli.

One of my donkeys received a PURPLE CROSS AWARD, which read 'and for all the donkeys used by John Simpson, for the exceptional work they performed on behalf of humans while under continual fire at Gallipoli during World War I (1915)'.

## A Recipe for Anzac Day

## **Chocolate Chip Anzac Biscuits**



What you need -An adult to help you, a baking tray and a saucepan.

#### Ingredients -

1 cup rolled oats
 1 cup plain flour
 1 cup sugar
 3/4 cup coconut
 1 tsp ground cinnamon

125 g dairy-free butter
2 tbs golden syrup
1/4 tsp bicarbonate of soda
1 tbs boiling water
1 cup (chips) dairy-free dark chocolate

### Method -

- 1. Preheat oven to 150c degrees. Grease a baking tray.
- 2. In a bowl, combine oats, flour, sugar, coconut and cinnamon and set aside.
- 3. Melt butter and golden syrup in a saucepan over gentle heat. Mix bicabonate of soda and water in a bowl and add to mixture.
- 4. Add melted butter mixture to dry ingredients and mix well. When combined, mix through some chocolate chips.
- 5. Place tablespoons of mixture onto greased oven tray, allowing for room to spread.
- 6. Bake for 20 minutes. Loosen from tray while warm then cool on trays.
