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Spotlight On Little Poss Member of the Month!

Hello, my name is Samuel.

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I am just three years old and I like to play with my Lego and with puzzles. My Mum says I'm a beautiful, fun-loving, cheeky and rambunctious little boy.

One of my most favourite things to do is ride my bike with my friends and family. I also love to eat CAKE and Oreos!

I like to watch movies too, especially Sherman and Peabody, The Lorax and the Lego movie.

I was diagnosed with epilepsy at one year of age after having an EEG, not long after my first seizure. Despite taking medication for eight months my seizures were still not controlled. I had some more tests and an MRI revealed more than one dozen tubers on my brain, which means I have something called Tuberous Sclerosis Complex.

About 2,000 people in Australia have it. TSC tumours can grow in any organ of the body, commonly affecting the brain, skin, heart, lungs and kidneys. TSC can also cause epilepsy, developmental delays and autism, which is what I have.



I have many different types of seizures, including focal, absence seizures and myoclonic jerks. I take lots of medications to try and stop the seizures. My big sister Arianna, is six and is very protective



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of me. She loves me too and she lets my Mum know when I am having a seizure. This is me and some photos of my family. Bye for now! Samuel.



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Ask Dr Dudley



Dear Dr. Dudley,

My parents say I have epilepsy, what is happening to me?

Dear Jeremy

That's a good question! Epilepsy is when something unusual happens in your brain. When your brain starts sending too many electrical messages, this can make different things happen to your body. These things have lots of names, like seizures, funny turns and attacks. We call them seizures. There are lots of different seizures.

You might know what's going on when you have a seizure. Or you might not know anything until it's all over.

This is what having a seizure can be like for some people:

- Getting a funny taste in your mouth
- Having a strange feeling in your tummy
- Pulling or tugging at your clothes
- Going stiff, then falling to the floor and jerking
- Staring into space for a few moments (people might think you're daydreaming)
- An arm or leg may suddenly move on its own

Sometimes it's really hard to describe exactly what it feels like for you. Most seizures only last a few minutes. Some only last a few seconds.

Some children can have seizures every day. And other children might only have them now and then. If you take epilepsy medicine, it might stop all your seizures.

You can't catch epilepsy from anyone. Lots of children and grown-ups have epilepsy. So there may be other children in your school with it.

Some children can have an operation on their brain to control their epilepsy. And some children go on a very special diet to try and stop their seizures.

Some children grow out of their epilepsy. So then the doctor says they can stop taking their epilepsy medicine. Others have to carry on with the medicine to make sure their seizures don't come back.

Whoever looks after you may get really worried when you first start having seizures. This is normal and probably pretty annoying. They may even want to sleep in your bedroom to make sure you are safe at night. They will calm down when they get some more information about epilepsy. If you can't get them to stop worrying, tell them to look at Epilepsy Queensland's website. Or they can call 1300 852 853. We'll try our best to help them.





Are We a Clone?


Two of the spaceships below are identical. If you don't get in a spin, you'll be able to spot them.



RAINBOW Fruit Skewers!


What you need: Some help from an adult!
